## **TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION**

**For students who require transportation, parents are asked to please call First Student (780-532-3545) in mid-June to make bussing arrangements. You will also need to contact them if your child will not be using the bus on any particular day (ie. illness or is getting picked up).**



All students are expected to attend all days. If your child is sick or has an appointment and will be away for all or part of a day, please let us know. ## **DAILY SCHEDULE**

The Reading University daily schedule may change from time to time; however, here is the basic daily overview. Students will cycle through 10 classes each day with breaks for lunch and snacks

8:45ish -Buses arrive

9:00-12:00 -Core learning activities. Small group instruction, centers, etc.

10:30ish - Morning Snack will be provided for all students

12:00 - 1:00 pm LUNCH will be provided for all students

1:00 pm – 3:00 Small group instruction,

3:00 pm Dismissal to buses. Parent pick up for students in the College cafeteria.

## **FIELD TRIPS**

There will be two field trips for students this year in their three week RU experience.

1. an afternoon of swimming at Eastlink Centre Friday - July 12th
2. a trip to Coles Bookstore in the Prairie Mall - Wednesday July 17th



Students will be moving around the COLLEGE throughout the day using many class rooms, computer labs and other facilities. HOME BASE for Reading University will be in the CAFETERIA.

If you are picking up your child at the end of the day, please come in to the CAFETERIA FOR PICKUP. We require picture ID before we can send your child home with anyone other than you. Should someone else be picking up your child, please let us know with a note, text or a phone call. We cannot release your child to anyone else without your permission.

### **Lunch and Snacks:**

Daily lunches and snacks will be provided for the children. If your child has special dietary requirements, then we ask that you send along a packed lunch to suit his/her needs.

### **Daily Schedule:**

Classes start at 9:00 am and end at 3:00 pm.

Students will be in small groups and will travel with their groups to 10 different classes each day.

### **Supplies:**

Backpacks and water bottles will be provided as will all supplies needed for the program.

Preferred footwear is running shoes as students will have daily PHYS ED outdoors as long as the weather cooperates.

## **LEARNING STATIONS**

At WORD PLAY students practice their facility with language in a theme centred environment where they will learn to take risks as readers in a comfortable, fun atmosphere.

At the LIBRARY students experience and share new as well as familiar stories, legends and literary characters in a relaxed setting.

WRITE ON is an engaging center where students collaboratively write and share their thoughts and ideas through exploration of new experiences

GUIDED READING allows and encourages students to talk about the stories they read under the guidance and support of their instructors.

MUSIC is where students experience reading with all its rhythm, cadence and movement . A very active station, students will enjoy being totally engaged in song, rhythm making and movement.

PUZZLE PIECES is where students enhance their oral language and problem solving skills by collaborating and sharing ideas with one another.

The FOLLOW THE LEADER station is where students practice giving, taking and and writing directions in a very hands-on activity centre

At FRIED PHRASES learn and practice the most frequently used words and phrases that occur in their reading.

At HOT STUFF students will enhance their higher order thinking and skills while learning the value of reading for meaning in everyday life using their own knowledge and experience as background.

At GET ACTIVE students explore a variety of cooperative physical activities and burn off excess energy with their friends.

At Grade 3 Reading University small group instruction is the key. We have the good fortune of being able to boast an adult to student ratio of approximately 1:5. One teacher and one educational assistant work with 10 students at a variety of learning tasks specifically designed and created to increase reading confidence, comprehension and fluency. Students will be highly engaged in a variety of learning experiences. They will practice:

1. collecting and retrieving information

2. understanding and sharing information

a. by making judgements about its quality, relevance , usefulness or efficiency

b. by finding and understanding the relationships between ideas

c. and by using and transferring knowledge

3. how to make sense of and bring order and understanding to information they have heard, seen or read.
